Our exploration of materials continued by looking closely at 2 objects to see what materials they are made of and why those materials were chosen. Spirals and colour were the focus of our art lesson inspired by the work of Andy Goldsworthy. Oak (Year 3-Year 6)

We've had a fantastic week in Oak Class! The children have been working hard and exploring some exciting topics across the curriculum.

This week, we've been learning about the famous sculptor Henry Moore. The children created an impressive double-page spread about his life and work, showcasing their research and creativity.

In Science, we used a data logger to measure lux levels (light intensity). The children were fascinated to see how technology helps us collect accurate data and understand the world around us.

Our Geography lessons focused on natural disasters, with a special look at how flooding affects our local area of Kingsbridge. The children asked brilliant questions and showed great curiosity about how communities respond to these challenges.

In RE, we explored the Five Pillars of Islam. The children learned what each pillar represents and then created their own set of five pillars based on values that are important to them. Their ideas were thoughtful and creative!

Art Club was a huge success as always! The children worked on metal embossing projects using a variety of templates, producing some stunning designs.

A big well done to everyone for their enthusiasm and hard work this week!
