# Oak Class


It's been a fantastic start to the half term in Oak Class, with plenty of hands-on learning, creative thinking, and cross-curricular connections. We've launched our new DT unit with a burst of creativity! The children have been thinking about innovative lamp designs, exploring materials, shapes, and functions. We learnt about the history of electricity, sparking curiosity about how inventions have evolved over time. Our new text for English, *The Diary of Iliona*, has captivated the class. This diary-style narrative offers a rich window into Roman life, perfectly complementing our history unit. The children are already making thoughtful connections between lliona's experiences and what they've learned about Roman Britain. In science, Year 3 have been investigating plants, sketching detailed diagrams and identifying key features such as roots, stems, leaves, and flowers. Years 5 & 6 have been busy classifying animals, learning how scientists group living things based on characteristics. From mammals to mollusks, the class has shown great enthusiasm and precision.
